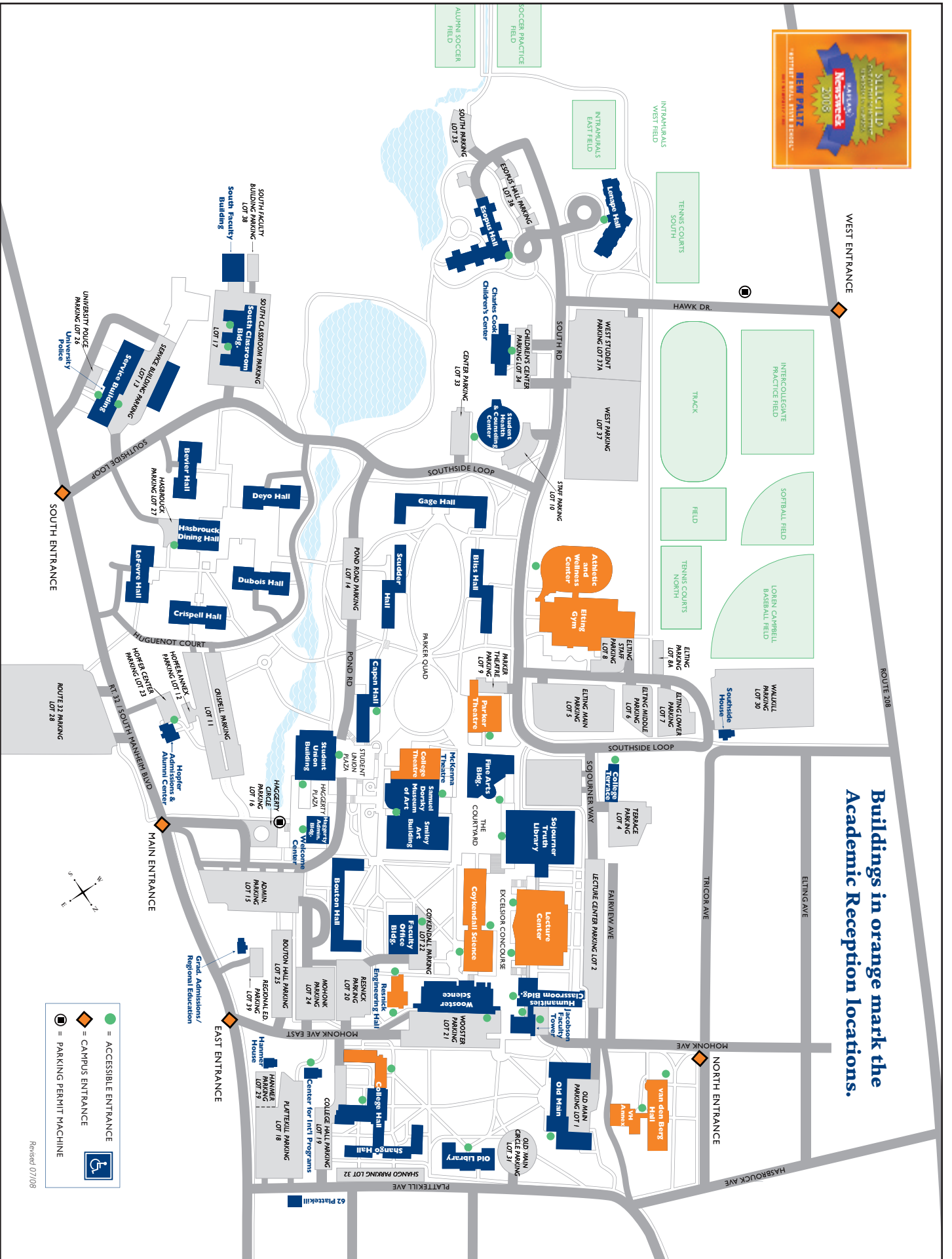




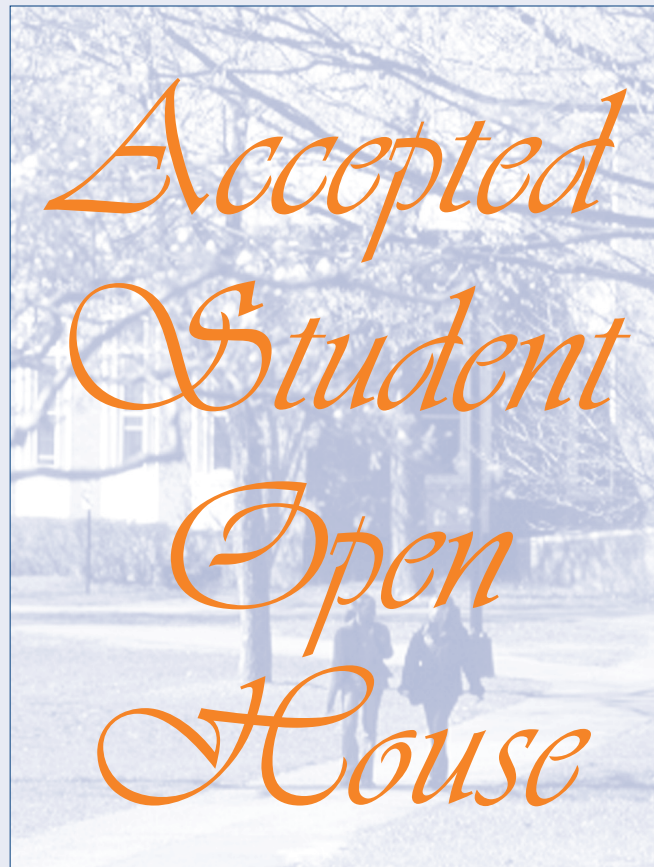
WEST ENTRANCE
