## Declaring a Major in Early Childhood/Childhood Education Birth-6

**Freshmen** are encouraged to declare Early Childhood/Childhood Education once they have chosen an academic concentration.

**Sophomores** may declare or change their major to Early Childhood/Childhood Education if they meet Checkpoint One requirements.

**Transfer students with junior status** may enter the Early Childhood/Childhood Education major if they meet Checkpoint Two requirements.

### Requirements & Responsibilities for Majors

**Checkpoint 1** is at the end of freshman year. Students should have an overall GPA of at least 3.0; a grade of B or better in Composition I; successful completion of EDI293; satisfactory Dispositions Assessment I; fingerprint clearance on a TEACH account; and 1<sup>st</sup> signed acknowledgement of Child Protection Policy training.

**Checkpoint 2** is the gateway into junior year. Students should have an overall GPA of at least 3.0 (2.5 in the concentration); a grade of B or better in Composition II; grades of C or better in required EDS, GEO, MAT and foreign language courses; grades of B- or better in EED courses; a passing score on the on-site writing sample; 30 hours of independent fieldwork; satisfactory Dispositions Assessment II; and completed EDI095 and the Child Abuse, SAVE, and DASA workshops.

**Checkpoint 3** is the gateway into student teaching. Students *must* have an overall GPA of at least 3.0 (2.5 in the concentration); grades of C or better in all required EDS, GEO, MAT and foreign language courses; grades of B- or better in all EED and SPE courses; and grades of S in all fieldwork placements. In addition, students must have satisfactory Dispositions Assessment III and “target” or “proficient” lesson/unit planning skills.

**Fieldwork and Student Teaching:** Students are responsible for arranging transportation, including carpooling, to all fieldwork and student teaching experiences. Placements will be assigned by the School of Education, and will be within a 45 mile radius of the student’s home that semester.

**Academic Policies:** Students may only repeat one EED or SPE required course, and may only repeat that course one time. Courses with S\*/U\* grades will not count toward program requirements. All coursework should be completed before the student teaching semester. Students are responsible for meeting all graduation requirements, including General Education, academic concentration, Early Childhood/Childhood Education, a Writing Intensive course, a total of at least 120 credits, 45 upper division credits, and 60 liberal art credits. *Students are responsible for monitoring their Progress Reports; meeting each semester with both Education and concentration advisors; and regularly checking New Paltz email, Blackboard, and the Education bulletin boards in Old Main.*

### Additional Certification Requirements

In order to receive New York State certification, candidates must pass the following NYS Teacher Certification tests: Educating All Students test (EAS); Multi-subject B-2 and 1-6 Content Specialty Tests (CSTs); and Teacher Performance Assessment (edTPA).
