How will I be notified if an emergency occurs on campus?

- The primary method is NP Alert. SUNY New Paltz students, faculty and staff can receive a phone call, text message, and/or e-mail in the event of a delay or cancellation due to inclement weather or on-campus emergency. But you need to make sure you are signed up! Visit the college's website for more info.
- Listen for outside audible speaker alerts over the college's mass notification speaker array system.
- Check the college's digital signage large screen TVs that are being installed in select buildings throughout the campus.
