Save the date: Barton Gellman's lecture "Secrets, Leaks and the National Security State"


Please join us for the 2022 James H. Ottaway Sr. Visiting Professor of Journalism's talk, "Secrets, Leaks and the National Security State," Tuesday April 5 at 7 p.m. in Lecture Center room 100.

Gellman led the Washington Post team that won a 2014 Pulitzer for coverage of Edward Snowden and the National Security Agency.

He's the author of *Dark Mirror*: *Edward Snowden and the American Surveillance State* and the bestselling *Angler: The Cheney Vice Presidency*.

At New Paltz this semester, he is teaching a class called "The Literature of Fact."
