

PSIR's New Faces



Heather G. Bennett, JD. Heather G. Bennett is a PhD student in the Political Science Department (Major Field Public Policy - Minor Field Public Law) at Rockefeller College of Public Affairs and Policy, SUNY Albany, where she is engaged in research related to her dissertation “How the Affordable Care Act is Changing the Way that Physicians Practice Medicine - Implications for Public Policy Reform Enactment.” Ms. Bennett is a 1994 graduate of Albany Law School. Following law school she served as counsel to the New York State Senate from 1994 to 2000, and as Executive Director and Counsel of the New York State Society of Orthopaedic Surgeons from 2000 to 2013. This fall semester, Professor Bennett will be teaching POL 319, Politics and Media



Max Crook. Max Crook received his Ph.D. from the University of Nottingham in 2015, a M.A. from Keele University, and a B.A. from Liverpool John Moores University. He teaches in the fields of International Relations, International Political Economy, European Politics, British Politics, and Political Theory. His research focuses on the British Labour Party, Social Democracy, and the Economic Policy of the 1974-1979 Labour Governments. He has two recent articles: Crook, M *et. al.* (2014) ‘The Enduring Relevance of Rosa Luxemburg’s The Accumulation of Capital’, *Journal of International Relations and Development*, Advance Online Publication, DOI: 10.1057/jird.2014.18; and Crook, M. (2014) ‘The Last Bastion of the Social Democratic Golden Age: The Welfare State without its Class Basis’, *Political Studies Review*, 12 (2), 239-247. This semester Professor Crook will be teaching POL 227 Introduction to International Politics, and POL 342 “Politics of Developing Areas.”



Philip Mauceri. Philip Mauceri earned a Ph. D. in Political Science at Columbia University in 1991 and an M.A. in 1985 and B.A. in 1983 from NYU. Professor Mauceri most recently served as Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs at New Paltz. Prior to that he was Dean of the College of Behavioral Sciences at the University of Northern Iowa. Before that Mauceri was a visiting assistant professor at the Centers of Latin American Studies at the University of Connecticut-Storrs and the University of Massachusetts-Amherst. He has also been a visiting lecturer or scholar at the Universidad Simón Bolívar in Caracas, Venezuela (summer 1993), the Department of Political Science at the University of Pennsylvania and the Instituto de Estudios Peruanos in Lima, Peru. Professor Mauceri joins the department to teach classes in Comparative Politics.



Scott Minkoff. Scott Minkoff’s research focuses on American local politics, political participation, political geography, and public policy. He is published in *American Politics Research*, *Political Geography*, *Urban Affairs Review*, and *Social Science Quarterly*. Most of his research utilizes quantitative methodologies with an emphasis on spatial statistics, geographic information systems, and network analysis. Prior to coming to New Paltz, he was an Assistant Professor at Barnard College in New York City. Professor Minkoff will teach courses in American politics and Public Policy.

Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty Review Conference



Sampson Oppeddisano and Hanna Kashara attended the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty Review Conference last spring.

They were two of 13 students chosen internationally to be a part of the 2015 BANg (Ban All Nukes Generation) Youth Delegation to the NPT review conference. They sat in on various meetings and side events where state delegates and foreign ministers discussed the treaty, how to improve it, and discussing the humanitarian consequences should a nuclear bomb be used.

Oppeddisano and Kashara were reporting on the conference as well as meeting with ambassadors (among them the US, Mexican, Swiss, and Austrian ambassadors).

Oppeddisano was also selected along one of the youth delegates to deliver the Youth Speech on behalf of BANG (and the youth of the world) to delegates, representatives, and NGOs on Friday, May 1st. You can catch his speech on Youtube (of course) at:
