**Cognates:** all CHS students are required to take 6 credits of cognates, i.e., courses related to Human Services, but not within the Department of Sociology. These courses can be from, e.g., Anthropology; Black Studies; Communication Disorders; Communication and Media; Education; History; Philosophy; Political Science and International Relations; Psychology; and Women, Gender and Sexuality.
