Academy Award winning filmmaker and best-selling author MICHAEL MOORE will be speaking on the importance of the youth vote in the 2016 election. Young people make up an increasing share of the US population yet they have the lowest rates of voter participation of any age group. At the same time the most pressing issues of the day, from climate change to student loan debt, will impact young people most severely. Moore brings his insightful political analysis and wry sense of humor to this lecture on why our fate rests on political mobilization among America's youth.

HOW TWO INCOMPATIBLE SCRED VALUES ARE DRIVING CONFLICT AND CONFUSION IN AMERICAN UNIVERSITIES

GUEST SPEAKER, DR. JONATHAN HAIDT

Thursday, September 29 at 7pm in Lecture Center Room 100

The College is pleased to welcome Jonathan Haidt, the Thomas Cooley Professor of Ethical Leadership at New York University's Stern School of Business. Making something sacred and then worshiping it together is an ancient and culturally universal means by which people bind themselves together into groups and institutions. Universities in the 20th century explicitly worshiped truth. In the 21st century, some universities began adding social justice as an additional sacred value. In this talk, Haidt will draw from his research on moral psychology to show why these two values sometimes conflict, and how that conflict is driving the anger and mutual incomprehension that has been dividing so many college campuses since last fall. Haidt will urge a schism as the only viable resolution: let some universities commit themselves completely to understanding the world while others commit themselves completely to changing it.
