In consultation, the student and adviser will adjust the plan to accommodate the student's prerequisite needs, transferred credits, and other such variables.

Students are responsible for reviewing their <u>Progress Reports</u> each semester to track their own progress toward degree requirements.

This elective might very well be used to take another language course. The Dept. of Philosophy recommends that all students study a foreign language at least through the intermediate level, if not beyond.

Courses meeting the non-Western requirement include the following:<u>PHI251 Indian</u> <u>Philosophy (WRLD)</u>, <u>PHI252 East Asian Philosophy (WRLD)</u>, <u>PHI330 Chinese</u> <u>Philosophy</u>, <u>PHI332 Buddhist Philosophy</u> These courses are offered in alternating years. <u>PHI471 Theory Of Knowledge</u>, <u>PHI474 Metaphysics</u>

<u>PHI490</u> Seminar, intended for upper-division majors, is offered each spring, and the subject will vary.
