

DECLARATION OF MINOR/CHANGE OF MINOR - Undergraduate

A minor program is a minimal but structured course of study within an academic discipline or interdisciplinary area. Students who elect to complete minor programs must also satisfy all college degree requirements and complete an academic major. One-half of the credits taken in the minor must be credits offered by The State University of New York at New Paltz. No courses in a student's minor program may be taken for the student-opted satisfactory/unsatisfactory (S*/U*) credit.

This form, signed by the chair of the department or by the program coordinator, is to be filed with the Registrar's Office, HAB 19. Students are expected to fulfill the minor requirements that are in effect at the time of declaration of the minor.
