

SUNY New Paltz hosting lecture on extremist violence

NEW PALTZ, N.Y. — A leading researcher studying the consequences of extremist violence and the efficacy of policies designed to prevent such violence will give a lecture at SUNY New Paltz on Wednesday, April 10.

Laura J. Dugan, professor and associate chair in the Department of Criminology at the University of Maryland and a member of the National Consortium for the Study of Terrorism and Responses to Terrorism, will give a lecture titled "Extremist Violence: Do U.S. Government Actions Make it Worse?" The lecture is free and open to the public. It will begin at 6 p.m. in Coykendall Science Building Auditorium.

In her lecture, Dugan will present a body of research into how certain actions by members of the United States government have affected terrorist activity and hate crimes against marginalized members of society.
