We anticipate no additional costs for this program revision as the total number of required credits does not change. Three credits have been shifted from the major's core requirements to the respective concentration requirements, and while some new courses will replace previous courses, course rotations and faculty teaching loads will not be affected. Faculty, facilities, and materials necessary for the new plan and courses are already in place or covered by existing resources. (Due to a recent resignation, a search is currently underway to replace one tenure-track faculty member.)
