This **Midterm Progress Survey** is the outcome of the significant efforts of a working group that met throughout the fall and winter. It is meant to meet the needs of our students. The purpose of the survey is to help direct students to supports available to them and provide timely advising information to students to make good grading option choices. Faculty with students in these cohorts will receive an email notification on **March 3**.

Prior to spring 2022, we used a midterm evaluation tool in my.newpaltz.edu to collect some of this information. The midterm evaluation tool is no longer available. We have created a **Midterm Progress Survey** in Starfish to provide students and the advisors with information they need to make appropriate choices for academic success.

Since this is the first administration using Starfish for this purpose, we will be seeking feedback from those faculty that participated in completing the survey.
