Clinical Mental Health Counseling Licensure Process

Final Semester Prior to Graduation

- 1. Complete Form 1: Application for Licensure; Submit to New York State Education Department (NYSED) along with \$371 fee. (https://eservices.nysed.gov/professions/before/018)
- 2. You can start applying for jobs prior to graduation or immediately following, regardless of the status of your Forms 1 & 2. However, you cannot begin counseling or counting those hours towards your 3,000 required supervised hours until (a) you have graduated and (b) your application for a limited permit has been approved.

After Graduate

- 1. Complete Part 1 of Form 2: Certification of Professional Education (https://eservices.nysed.gov/professions/before/018)
 - a. Submit Form 2 to the SUNY New Paltz Registrar's Office (recreg@newpaltz.edu) who will send the completed document to NYSED (they need to send it; NYSED will not accept transcripts from you). There is no fee for the form to be completed but there is a \$10 fee to have your transcripts sent to NYSED.
- 2. NYSED Office of Professions will send you a notification acknowledging that the educational requirements have been met and that you are now eligible to sit for the licensure exam.

Licensure Exam

- 3. Register with NBCC to take the NCMHCE (https://www.nbcc.org/licensure/examregistration)
 *make sure you register for state licensure (NCMHCE) not certification (NCE).
 - New York State has opted to use the National Clinical Mental Health Counseling Exam (NCMHCE) as its licensure exam. NCMHCE is administered by National Board of Certified Counselors (NBCC).
 - b. This test is computer based and offered at various locations across the state.
 - c. When you apply to take the exam with NBCC you will chose a site and date for the exam. It must be within 6 months of the time authorized by NYSED.
 - d. The test measures competency in two major clinical areas "Information Gathering" and "Decision Making". In order to receive an over-all passing grade on the exam, you must receive passing grades in both areas.
 - e. **alumni recommend taking this exam soon after you graduate. Do not wait until you have completed your 3,000 supervised hours.**
- 4. Study for the NCMHCE
 - a. our alumni recommend <u>www.counselingexam.com</u>
 - b. NYMHCA offers a licensing exam prep course
 - c. NCMHCE has a study guide available on their website
- 5. Take the Exam (if you do not pass the examination the first time, there is a three month waiting period until you can take it again).

Limited Permit

- 6. Look for a job at a work site registered with the Office of Mental Health (ask to see their OMH certificate)
- 7. Ask supervisor at job site to help you apply for your limited permit. (*you can apply for your limited permit prior to taking the licensure exam*)

 - i. You complete Part I; your supervisor completes Part II
 - ii. Submit to NYSED Office of the Professions with \$70 fee.
 - iii. If you change supervisors or work at additional settings, you will need to submit another application. Each application only covers a specific supervisor and work setting.
