A minor program is a minimal but structured course of study within an academic discipline or interdisciplinary area. No courses in a student's minor program may be taken for the student-opted satisfactory/unsatisfactory (S*/U*) credit. Students who elect to complete minor programs must also satisfy all college degree requirements and complete an academic major. In addition, the following applies:

- at least half of the credits for the minor must not be contained within the program plan of the student's major (this includes major courses as well as cognate courses)
- at least half of the credits for each minor must not be contained in additional minors
- at least half of the credits for the minor must be completed at New Paltz

This form, signed by the chair of the department or by the program coordinator, is to be filed with the Office of Records & Registration. Students are expected to fulfill the minor requirements that are in effect at the time of declaration of the minor.
