First Destination Report

To report on outcomes for our baccalaureate graduates we use information from a variety of sources including:

- Graduating Student Survey administered in April
- Post-Graduation Survey administered 3-months after graduation
- Employment data posted on LinkedIn
- Graduate school enrollment data from National Student Clearinghouse

We use the term "knowledge rate" instead of "response rate" for our results to reflect the range of sources for the information which goes beyond the pre and post-graduation surveys.


