Arrival:

You should plan to arrive between 9-9:30 am and park in the Shango or Haggerty Administration Building parking lots, which are a one- to five-minute walk from Science Hall. We will be meeting in the first floor of Science Hall for registration and breakfast. We will get started at 9:30 am.

Workshops, Talks, and Networking:

Primary goals of this conference are learning, sharing, and networking. ALPhA members from the New York region and nearby states will be presenting workshops on an advanced lab topic and discussing teaching strategies and experiments. All participants will generate ideas on particular topics relevant to teaching in the advanced lab and share them with the group.

****Special Make-and-Take workshop!** Participants will be introduced to MicroPython and the TinyPICO microcontroller with applications of an environmental sensor, an alpha particle counter, or an I-V diode curve measurement. This workshop must be pre-registered and has a cost of \$40.
