The majority of my time with Local 751 has been devoted to outreach, not only to union members through the formation of a newsletter, but to the campus community. I have participated in organizing the Student Labor Coalition, in which we hope to create a safe space for non-unionized

Sodexo student workers to express grievances, as well as the formation of a SUNY New Paltz Labor Council. Both of these bodies will, hopefully, provide strength in numbers to Local 751. 
