Keep the following in mind as you plan out your schedule:

- We are reserving spots in senior seminars for *both* Fall 2019 and Spring 2020. You *must* email Jeff Miller (millerj@newpaltz.edu) to save yourself a spot. Priority will be given to graduating seniors on a first-come, first-served basis.
- POL 350 Introduction to Law will also be offered online during the Summer 2019 session.
- POL 300 Political Science Research Methods is a pre-requisite for the senior seminar. You must take it *before* the seminar.
- The History Department will not be offering HIS 379 American Foreign Policy in the 2020-2021 academic year, so the only course fulfilling the IR Foreign Policy course requirement is POL 366 American Foreign Policy, which is offered this coming fall.

LAURA DUGAN is a Professor in the Department of Criminology and Criminal Justice at the University of Maryland. She is a coprincipal investigator for the Global Terrorism Database (GTD) and the Government Actions in Terrorist Environments (GATE) dataset. The GTD is the most comprehensive source of terrorist incidents, as it records all known attacks across the globe since 1970.


