NY Legal Education Opportunity Program

Leo Program Objective



The New York State Judicial Institute will host the 2019 New York Legal Education Opportunity Program (NY LEO) on the campus of the Elisabeth Haub School of Law at Pace University, located in White Plains, NY, June 3-July 12, 2019.

The program is designed to ensure a diverse legal community by promoting academic success in law school for individuals historically underrepresented in the legal profession. Through an intense six-week summer program, NY LEO assists minority, low income, and economically or educationally

disadvantaged college graduates in acquiring the fundamental and practical skills necessary to succeed in law school.

NY LEO is administered by the Honorable Juanita Bing Newton, Dean of the New York State Judicial Institute. Applications are accepted on a rolling basis.

Our Climate Summer/Fall Fellowship

Put A Price On It is a national campaign led by [Our Climate](#) and [The YEARS Project](#), which mobilizes young people to advocate for strong and equitable carbon pricing policies at the state and national level. By putting a price on carbon, we will hold polluters accountable and transition our economy to a clean energy future. Students will train and organize other students, rallying public support for carbon pricing policy, and engage directly with elected officials in New York State. Applications are currently being accepted for our Summer 2019 fellowship positions.

Fellowship description & responsibilities: Fellows will work closely with Our Climate's New York State Director and other staff to achieve mutually agreed upon goals. This educational and supportive arrangement is designed to build a stronger and more diverse coalition of young leaders needed to pass fair and effective climate policy in New York State. Fellows will be trained to conduct public outreach on the local and state level to build support for carbon pricing. There are three Fellowships per year: Spring (January-May), Summer (June-August), and Fall (September-December). Fellow responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- Seeking and securing campaign endorsements from businesses, cities, college and university presidents, organizations, and prominent individuals;
- Identifying and securing opportunities to attend and participate in community events to build support for carbon pricing;
- Participating in phone banks and list-building activities;
- Writing and submitting media materials, including letters to the editor, op-eds, and press releases;
- Helping to organize informational and community-building events (concerts, house parties, forums, etc.).

Additionally, fellows will be encouraged to actively participate in team decisions around strategy, effective messaging, targeted outreach, and more.

Qualifications:

- A strong passion for, and commitment to, climate action & justice
- Self-motivated and able to work both independently and with a team
- Proven leadership and involvement on campus and/or the community
- Goal oriented with great organizational and communication skills

These times are flexible and can be modified based on Fellows' availability.

Time commitment: 5-10 hours a week

Compensation: The shorter Summer fellowship is unpaid. Spring and Fall Fellows receive a stipend of **\$500**.
