MEET A PRESENTER PRISCILLA DECONTI

Priscilla De Conti is one of LLI's new presenters. In the fall, she taught an introductory Zentangle class which will be offered again in Spring 2022. We asked Priscilla some questions about Zentangle.

LLI: What is Zentangle?

PD: Zentangle is a method of drawing that focuses on lines, shapes and repetitive patterns. It is a way that a person can create art where no previous art experience is necessary or needed.

LLI: When and how did Zentangle originate?

PD: Maria Thomas and Rick Roberts developed Zentangle in 2003. Maria created botanical prints and with her calligraphy expertise sold her work at art fairs. One day while creating these drawings she started drawing background patterns and found the experience quite unique. Thus, Zentangle was created.

LLI: How did you learn about Zentangle and what training did you need to teach it?

PD: I learned about Zentangle while participating in Artist's Way. I am a doodler at heart and took beginner classes in Albany and Cairo. Afterwards, I decided to train as a teacher and took classes in Rhode Island and became certified in 2017.

LLI: Are there any benefits from practicing Zentangle?

PD: Yes. Some of the benefits are Mindfulness, Focus, Relaxation, Confidence, Improved Self Esteem and A Feeling of Well Being.

LLI: Where do you teach Zentangle?

PD: In addition to LLI at SUNY New Paltz, I have taught classes in Dutchess County to a Breast Cancer Survivor group and at Women's Wellness Retreats in Claryville.


LLI: Is there a Zentangle community?

PD: Definitely Yes! There is a diverse group of men and women all over the world practicing this art form. They are open, supportive and share ideas. It is also a great art form for children.

LLI: What other art mediums do you enjoy?

PD: I enjoy watercolor, colored pencils, and collage and recently had my work displayed at the Art Society Kingston Gallery. I also create and sell greeting cards, art work, jewelry, and tee shirts at craft fairs and vendor events.

UPDATE ON FUTURE SEMESTERS

A lot has happened since the onset of the COVID pandemic in March of 2020. We are reaching out to all members of LLI, current and recent, to provide an update of the happenings at LLI and to invite you and your friends and/or family to consider rejoining LLI in case you have not done so already.

Due to COVID, we had to cancel our Spring 2020 semester. We quickly moved to providing classes for Fall 2020 in an online format, choosing Zoom as our platform. We all learned together what it would take to continue in this new way, and we continue to learn today. After all, that is what LLI is all about – continued learning!

We have surveyed our members, former and current, and we have listened.

We are excited to be offering a <u>Winter Session for 2022</u> (all online), and are working hard to offer a variety of classes in the Spring that are online, or in-person. The options of course delivery within careful safety measures continue to be fluid and ever-changing, and we continue to adapt.

At the time of this writing, SUNY New Paltz requires all visitors on campus and all students to be vaccinated. SUNY students and staff must prove vaccination status by providing appropriate documentation. If we offer LLI classes on-campus, we must also collect the same documentation from members taking in-person classes and provide it to the college in advance of classes. This latter requirement is not something that LLI is equipped technologically to handle in an efficient and simple manner at this time, although we are exploring methods to make this happen in the future.

Therefore, for the Spring, we will continue to offer online classes, as well as some in-person classes in other New Paltz locations. We will require all those who take in-person classes **to be fully vaccinated and to wear a mask while indoors.**

Additionally, we plan to offer a new option for those of you interested in learning more about Zoom, called Zoom School. More information is available on the last page.

LLI AT SUNY NP MEMBERSHIP/BENEFITS

Membership fee of \$120 entitles you to enroll in 6 classes out of a diverse selection of courses in both the Fall and Spring semesters. You are also invited to many other LLI events, including trips and informative seminars.

Once the campus reopens for visitors: The classrooms we use on Wednesdays and the technical support the presenters receive during classes are all provided free from SUNY. The SUNY administration is happy to have LLI on campus and offers the following discounts and opportunities to our students beyond our reduced-price parking tags:

Members are allowed to join the new Wellness Center on campus for a reduced fee for one semester or for the year. This gives one access to the circuit, the weight room and the dance classes. The old Elting Gym also has a swimming pool, racquetball courts and ping pong tables available.

The Department of Fine and Performing Arts gladly accepts the LLI membership card as a form of student identification. The card allows one to pay the reduced student rate for art (Dorsky Museum), theater (McKenna and Parker) and special events (Lecture Center). You can use the library but by becoming a Friend of the Library for a minimum donation of \$30, you are able to take books out of the library as well.

The various campus dining options are always available to everyone. The remodeled Wooster Hall (which is just across the concourse from Humanities and Lecture Center classes) now hosts a lovely restaurant.

AUDITING SUNY-NEW PALTZ CLASSES

Once the campus reopens for visitors: Persons over 60 years of age, who would like to audit a course must obtain an audit form from the Office of Records and Registration. The completed form must have the approval and signatures of the chair of the department offering the course and the course instructor. The audit form must be returned to the department offering the course by the end of the "course add period."

The audit privilege permits the auditor to attend a course, providing there is room in the course and the necessary approvals have been granted, and to do assignments, but it does not permit the auditor to take examinations in the course or to have his/her work evaluated in any other way. The auditor receives no grade for the course, nor is any record of course attendance kept in the Office of Records and Registration.

Audit privileges are not ordinarily available in studio, online, laboratory or performance courses, or courses where class participation of students is of major importance, nor are they available in credit-free courses offered by the institution or in any foreign study program or course.
